# Excursion and practical fieldwork to Thailand and Myanmar 11.-24.9.2017 (14 days)

## **Topics**

Urban and Regional Development in Peripheraland Mountain Areas ofSoutheastAsia: EconomicCorridor Development fromKhonKaento Mae SotandMyawaddytoBago

#### Aims

The courseaims at deepeningtheknowledgeandunderstandingthe urban and regional development in peripheralandmountainareasofSoutheastAsia, in particulartheemerging so-called East West Corridorof Myanmar and Thailand. Overarchingconceptsandapproachesof regional andcorridordevelopment will be dealt withandtheGreater Mekong Subregion plans will beexplained. In moredetails, theagricultural, industrial, service-, trade-andtourism-related current urban and regional developments will beinvestigated. Moreover, withintheemergingandnewinterconnectivityofSoutheastasia, thegrowingtransportation, exchange, trade, migrationandsocialconnections will be dealt with. Finally, thepotentialsofgrowingborderconnections will beinvestigated, a SWOT analysisfor an indepthevaluation will beaddedandrecommendations will begiven.

Fromthemethologicalpointofview, quantitative and qualitative methodsofresearch will beapplied, mappingand GPS-basedroutinganddocumentationaswellas PUA methods will beintroduced. In ordertoenhancetheparticipant'scapacity in teachingandleadership, eachparticipant will bequalified in leadingpartsoftheexcursionandfieldwork. The set-upof a jointliteratureanddatabank will supportfutureindependentteachingof all participants. The participants will jointlywithotherscontributeto a comprehensivedailyreport, will develop a posterand will contributetothefinalreportanddocumentation.

To summarise: The course will enhance the qualification of all participants in respect to widening the urban and region-based comprehensive and application-oriented knowledge about Northeast Thailand and Southeast Myanmar and will qualify all participants with further and deeper knowledge and experience in Higher Education. Furthermore, the participants will gain expertise in preparing and conducting fieldwork, modern teaching methodology and leadership skills.

## Research Background

Southeast Asia is growingly connecting. Cross-border connections allow for an intensified exchange of goods, people and knowledge. Among the most important corridors is the East-West-Corridor from Vietnam via Laos and Thailand to Myanmar, which will in the future further be connected to South Asia. The excursion will focus on the development corridor from Thailand to Myanmar, i.e. from KhonKaen via Phitsanulok and Sukhtothai to Myawaddy and Hpa-an to Bago. It will deal with the research question how regional and urban development in peripheral and mountain areas in times of regional and urban transformation and connectivity can be connected to the new corridor.

Methodological skills will comprise: mapping, interview techniques, rapid urban appraisal, structured participatory observation, multi-level interpretation of data and triangulation.

Participants must have an adequate command of the English language. It is compulsory for the participants to give presentations and papers and to comply with assigned readings. Participation in the connected seminar is compulsory; this will take place partly as bloc seminar before the excursion at the end of the summer term, partly during the excursion.

Student contributions: a) presentation and written homework within the seminar, b) active fieldwork, presentation of a region-based topic and reports in joint group work during the excursion, c) poster and report on findings.
